

101235	Morphology	(3 credit hours)	(prerequisite -)
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This course teaches the student to research the morphing of the word and the change in its structure. It deals with topics including the concept of Morphology, gerundives, derivatives, morphological measurement, and declension of nouns and verbs. The student is also taught a number of its functional issues, including: States of pause and junction, triliteral roots, verbal predication, phonemic and non-phonemic glottal stops (hamzat qat' and hamzat wasl), and the meeting of two still letters. The student is then trained in inspecting morphological matters in specialized sources.
