\* Course Description:

Students will learn how toanalyze fiction by studying elements of the novel: plot, characterization, conflict, setting, and theme. In addition, the coursewill explain how to study techniques of the novel: point of view, style, symbolism, imagery andirony. Genres of the novel: Social Novel, Psychological Novel, Education Novel, Philosophical Novel, PopularNovel, and Experimental Novel, will be elaborated on, in addition tohistory of the novel includingearly narrative forms, 16<sup>th</sup> and 17<sup>th</sup>Centuries, 18<sup>th</sup>century, 19<sup>th</sup>century, 20<sup>th</sup>century, and 21<sup>st</sup>century. *Guliver's Travels*by Jonathan Swift and *The Great Gatsbey*by F. Scott Fitzgerald will be studied as two examples of the novel.

# \* Objectives:

This course aims at studying the elements of the novel, its types, techniques and its historical development. Students will be capable of analysing any novel after learning how to implement the tools of analysis related to the elements and different techniques of the novel.

#### \* General Outcome:

At the end of the course the student is supposed to:

- 1- Know the definition, the elements and techniques of the different types of novels.
- 2- Apply the elements and techniques to analyse chosen novels.
