 * Course Description: This course gives a general presentation of the literary trends and movements of the era (Restoration & neo-classical) with special emphasis on the works of the most famous writers. 1- John Dryden and Milton) and 2- Restoration drama of manners (Congreve) 3- Alexander Pope (<i>The Rape of the Lock</i>) 4- Sheridan (anti-sentimental drama) (themes relate to the new form of freedom, anti-Puritanism, satire of country manners and of the lavish, cynical, almost degenerate type of life of the upper- middle classes of London society)
* Objectives:
1-Instructs students the most important genres of the time (drama and poetry)
2- instructs students how to analyze and read literary texts
3- completes students' knowledge of the pre-romantic literary scene.

* General Outcome:

Students should be able to read and analyze texts from the 17th. And 18th. Centuries with fluid and constant knowledge of the times and the trends of these literary texts.
