<ul> <li>* Course Description: This course gives a general presentation of the literary trends and movements of the era (Restoration &amp; neo-classical) with special emphasis on the works of the most famous writers.</li> <li>1- John Dryden and Milton) and</li> <li>2- Restoration drama of manners (Congreve)</li> <li>3- Alexander Pope (<i>The Rape of the Lock</i>)</li> <li>4- Sheridan (anti-sentimental drama) (themes relate to the new form of freedom, anti-Puritanism, satire of country manners and of the lavish, cynical, almost degenerate type of life of the upper- middle classes of London society)</li> </ul>

1-Instructs students the most important genres of the time (drama and poetry)
2- instructs students how to analyze and read literary texts
3- completes students' knowledge of the pre-romantic literary scene.
