Number of credit hours: 3

Theoretical basis and principles of vital signs: body temperature, respiration, pulse, and blood pressure; medication administration, skin integrity and wound care; oxygenation and perfusion; circulation; fluid and electrolyte balance; acid-base balance; perioperative care

Course Number: (09011202) Course Name: Fundamental of Nursing (Lab)
Number of credit hours: 3

Knowledge and practical application of basic nursing skills learned in Fundamental of Nursing (Theory) that covers: Hand washing; applying and removing personal protective equipment, sterile gloves; asepsis, establishing and maintaining a sterile field, wound dressing, wound irrigation; nasogastric tube insertion and removal; enteral feeding, caring for gastrostomy and jejunostomy tube site; vital signs, temperature, pulse, respiration; blood pressure; administering oxygen, suctioning: oropharyngeal, nasopharyngeal and tracheal, measuring oxygen saturation; administering medication: ophthalmic, ear, oral, injections, vaginal, metered dose inhaler; establishing IV access: IV fluid administration and regulating, use of infusion pumps; urinary, Inserting straight and indwelling urinary catheter (male, female), obtaining urine specimen, perineal care and folly's catheter care; bowel, assisting a client with a bedpan, administering enema, colostomy care, obtaining stool specimen; body mechanics; positioning a client: fowler, semi-fowler, supine, prone, lateral, Trendelenburg position, sim's; moving and turning a client in bed, transferring and turning a client, assisting a clients to walk, assisting a client using walker.

Number of credit hours: 4 (3 Theory + 1 Lab)

Knowledge and skills necessary to perform health assessment for individuals of all ages, with emphasis on adult clients; skills of history taking: inspection, palpation, percussion, and auscultation while comparing normal findings and common deviation from normal of each of the major body systems. The practice of health assessment skills will occur in the faculty of nursing laboratories.

Promoting, maintaining, and restoring the health of clients/patients and their families. The biopsychosocial responses of actual and high-risk conditions affect an individual's functional health patterns. The nursing process concepts, health assessment, medical treatments, critical thinking, integrating relevant research findings, and assisting with client education are integrated within each system. Number of credit hours: 3

The nursing process of care for clients/patients with an alteration in functional health patterns as mentioned in **Adult Health Nursing I (Theory)** in various hospital settings utilizing the nursing process. Acute and long term (chronic) cases that focus on selected concepts relevant to the functional health patterns, including nutritional-metabolic, stress and coping/cognitive-perceptual, patient/client safety, oxygenation, pain management, fluid and electrolyte, activity and exercise, sleep and rest, skin integrity, sexuality, and elimination patterns. Concept-based learning facilitates clinical training, clinical reasoning, critical thinking, communication skills, problem-solving, and decision-making related to different health problems.

Application of critical thinking, clinical decision-making, and evidence-based nursing practice to adults' complex and major health problems (i.e., acute coronary syndrome, brain injury, hemodynamic instability, and other important critical health alterations). The course also integrates and expands knowledge of
